### **Introduction**

#### Greetings of the day!!!!!

We are glad to announce that our School - Isaac Newton Global School has successfully completed 6yrs under the support and Guidance of THE BASSEIN EDUCATION SOCIETY, who has devoted approximately 88 years in the field of Education. After a period of 6 years the vertical and horizontal growth of the school was very vivid as the school witnessed an extension of grade 6 and increased divisions. This in itself proves the achievement of the school.

Our students of grades 1 to 6 walked into the school on 7<sup>th</sup> April 2019, with new energy and enthusiasm to commence the new academic year filled with new dreams and surprises. The students were warmly welcomed at the school assembly by the entire team.

The most significant change in 2019 – 20, was that a planned ALMANAC was provided to the students to make the Teaching – learning process effective. To plan all these activities all the stakeholders were involved and we are thankful to them to spare their valuable time and to provide us with their feedbacks, reviews and inputs so that our children get an environment which helps in their overall development. The habits of work and the love of learning that emerges in such an environment where we actively engage the child's interest, self-discipline, concentration, self-confidence and motivation will enable the child to undertake whatever it is they need to do. In school and into adulthood, education is about developing good 'Habits of a lifetime'.

The increase and stability in students' number last year led to a sound financial foundation for current year. We thank the Trust members and School Managing Committee for granting approval to fund initiatives to improve the school environment and also to facilitate an

improved learning experience for our students. Some of these were the purchase of new furniture, teaching aids, and purchase of laptops for each class teacher. Additions and upgrade were made to existing ICT devices for use by part time staff and students.

In house training were given to the teachers such as Language Coordinator, the Curriculum Coordinator, the Digital Technologies Coordinator and the Inclusive Education Consultants, they used the opportunity for both formal and informal professional development and facilitated collaboration between staff members. The in-house sessions afforded the double advantages of being able to tailor the sessions to our particular needs, while at the same time keeping our costs low. Staff found this to be very valuable.

We have in the past relied on the goodwill, and availability for parents and staff to transport our children to sporting venues and other field trips. Our curriculum pays great attention on the academic achievements of students, while these are of course very important we must not lose sight of what sustains the academic work of students, of those intangible unmeasurable qualities that can be nurtured but not taught. Our teachers work closely with our children, observing their work and offering the lessons and opportunities that the child needs to progress their understanding. The overall results do not tell the teachers more than they already have observed in individual children and are already working to address. However, we are pleased that our students performed to the best of their ability with the vast majority being above the benchmark.

# **School Safety initiative**

#### 1. Fire safety Awareness:

An emergency mock fire drills were conducted in school to train children on the evacuation process. These safety drills are conducted in the school on regular basis. Students are suppose to come out of the school premises on the sound of fire alarm, teachers will take their students to the designated safety area and then students are made aware of how to handle themselves in the event of a fire break-out. Students were given a first-hand experience on handling fire extinguishers.


#### 2. Earthquake Drill:

In the event of an earthquake or imminent danger the staff and students need to be aware of the procedures using the drop command and put them into effect immediately. An emergency drill will be conducted once in the academic year for the same. While the signal is ongoing, the participants move away from windows, glass and unsecured objects immediately. Every participant performs "DROP, COVER, HOLD" under tables, desks or chairs until the "Shaking" signal comes to an end. Drop, Cover Hold.

### 3. CCTV Security Camera

Investment in surveillance camera systems by school management ensures parents and guardians that the general safety and security of children are being addressed during schools hours and at all afterschool extracurricular activities and programs. **CCTV** cameras aid monitoring and preventing bullying amongst students. They help in **ensuring discipline** and punctuality amongst students. Prevent or track student thefts. Keep parents

mind at ease about **school security and environment**. This has proved to be a **great relief to parents** that they can see their wards when away from them. It also help school security personnel to take quick action about evacuating children, faculty and staff in case of emergencies related to fire or other potentially dangerous situations.





# **Social Welfare**

### Visit to Orphanage

INGS tries to make its students humane and empathetic towards the less privileged of the Society. We feel happy that we could reach out to the children at the orphanage. We were overwhelmed by the generous response to our appeal for help that every student contributed in their own special way to arrange for a small program for these children and gift them with little gifts on the occasion of Christmas- a season of sharing love and joy.

### **Visit to police station:**

A visit to a local police station was arranged for the students. During the visit the students are made aware of the functioning of the police station, the **role of police in society and the procedural aspects of complaint**. A discussion with the Senior Police Inspector and other officials in the Police Station help the students understand the procedure of filing a FIR, the difference between a cognizable and non-cognizable offenses and the role a copperforms in the process of investigation.

# **Health Care for a Healthy Personality**

**Emotional Health:** Counselling facility is provided to all the students on two days of the week by our school counsellor, Mrs. Suzanne. A meeting with the parents and students is arranged to solve the academic and emotional problems of the students and proper records are maintained for feedback.

**Physical Health:** Knowing that our senior most grades are moving towards adolescence (a phase that needs to be addressed well) a workshop was conducted for students of grades 5 and 6. The students were informed of various physical changes taking place and how to handle these hormonal changes positively. Along with this, a questionnaire session was conducted when children posed their queries which were handled effectively.

Good Touch Bad Touch Sessions: In today's world, it is imperative that parents talk to their children about the differences between right and wrong, appropriate and inappropriate. The concept of 'good touch and bad touch' is still a hush-hush topic in households and classrooms. Most parents have a difficult time addressing this topic, but this doesn't mean that the topic can be avoided as well. Children must be educated on the difference between acceptable touch i.e good touch and inappropriate touch i.e bad touch. For this we at INGS conducted session for students in order to maintain the good level of safety and security for each grade students so that every child to be aware of that their body belongs to them and they have a right to protect it.





**Doctor on call:** While every precaution is taken by the school to provide a safe and secured environment for the students, in the unfortunate eventuality of an accident or student falling ill, the first step will be to call a doctor. If the incident is minor, the school will administer the treatment. However, in case of any major incident the school may need to call a doctor. Parents will be informed of the incident as soon as possible and requested to collect their ward from school.

# **Science Exhibition**

A science exhibition was held on 30<sup>th</sup> November, 2019 wherein students showcased their talents on creativity and innovation. The objective was not only to inculcate a scientific attitude and researchmindedness but also creating teaching aids. It involves students to participate in activities so as to understand the cognitive, affective and psychomotor aspects of the task. The Science Exhibition is held as part of the National Science Day celebration carried out at School of Education. Student-teachers participated in this activity and made models which are used as teaching aids later. They had chosen topics from NCERT Curriculum.

Students had made still models, working models, charts and posters to present their topics. Prof Shibu Nair took the initiative of encouraging the students to put up such a wonderful and enlightening exhibition. The parents appreciated the students. They asked students about the scientific concepts forming the foundation of the models. Students had prepared models like digestive system, food chain, working of a wind mill, pollution was showcased along with the DC Motor based models. Charts based on evolution of humans and biodiversity were presented well. Students were encouraged to develop a scientific fervour and an attitude of research mindedness so that they develop the qualities of analytical and critical thinking.









## **Parent Teacher Association**

During open house teachers explained the strength & area for improvement with individual students among parents. Parents were happy with the innovative **journey of teaching & learning.** The active cooperation of parents with the school is an essential prerequisite for the welfare of the students. # **Phonics**

At Isaac Newton Global School, we include phonics, speech and drama program from Pre-school to Grade III in curriculum **Phonics** instruction teaches children how to decode letters into their respective sounds, a skill that is **essential** for them to read unfamiliar words by themselves. Keep in mind that most words are in fact unfamiliar to early readers in print, even if they have spoken knowledge of the word. To see the children go from learning phonics to reading their first book with words, is a journey, which all children should be proud of and it is a cause for great celebration!!!! This Program helps to develop a strong foundation in English language learning by integrating phonics into the learning of reading, writing and spelling of words.

Speech and drama is an empowering way for children who enjoy acting and would like to be confident speakers and develop presentation skills. It helps children to learn effective and clear communication that will serve them throughout their life. ... Classes involve a range of speaking and performing exercises that focus on developing clear speech and confident communication. Speech & Drama teaches children to appreciate, understand and develop powerful vocal clarity, expression and projection. Children learn how different words, intonation, body language, movement and stance affect and reinforce spoken communication.

## **VISHAKHA & POCSO**

To safeguard the interests of the learners, **Isaac Newton Global School** set up the **VISHAKHA** (To deal with complaints of sexual harassment of female employees of the School) & **POCSO** Committee (set up under the provisions of Prevention of Children from Sexual Offence Act 2012) on 19<sup>th</sup> September 2019.

A meeting to educate the staff of the VISHAKA GUIDELINES COMMITTEE was conducted in the school on 19th September 2019. Sexual harassment is a violation of fundamental rights of equality, right against sex based discrimination, right to work of women and right to life and dignity. It is here that Vishaka Committee (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 plays an important role. The entire staff was made aware of Vishaka guidelines in detail and the intention behind forming the Committee. Pradnya Ma'am who is one of our Trust Member as well as an active member of the NGO, gave her inputs on the same and shared her experience on the do's and don'ts of the committee.
